## "What in God's name are we doing in Centreville, Virginia?"

Many years ago, this statement was on a sign in St. John's parish hall. These words are as relevant today as they were then – how are we sharing God's love and abundance to others? Throughout the Bible we are reminded that God is a giver of all good things. God gives us life and "this fragile earth, our island home," as we say in our prayers. In turn, we share these good things with others.

St. John's has long been a vital part of the local community. We share our amazing, historic facility with many Ministry Partners and community groups and provide generous offerings to those in need. We contribute to Western Fairfax Christian Ministries, including food grown in our own St. John's creation care garden. We support the Katherine K. Hanley Family Shelter, donate school supplies to London Towne Elementary School, and make and serve dinners for Tree of Life at Sterling Community Center, and more. Beyond our Sunday services, which are offered in person and online, St. John's provides opportunities to expand our understanding of Scripture through the weekly Adult Lectionary Forum, evening programs like Summer with the Psalms, and our Education for Ministry (EfM) group.

This year, we welcomed as priest-in-charge The Rev. Kevin Laskowski, along with his wife Allison and their three sons. Father Kevin has embraced St. John's mission of Healing, Hope, and Hospitality as priorities for the year to come:

- Healing: worship God and proclaim the Good News of God in prayer, sermon, and song
- Hope: form disciples of Jesus Christ, of all ages, in word and deed
- Hospitality: steward our historic building and grounds for our parishioners, ministry partners, and beyond



Now is the time that we need to prayerfully consider how to support St John's next year in terms of time, talent, and treasure. Parishioners have been exceptionally generous in their support, being a "small in size but large in heart" congregation.
